- are **willing to try a small group setting** with specialist facilitation, peer support, and opportunities for family/carer involvement.
- are **independent in personal care** (or whose continence is managed sufficiently well to cope with a 2-3 hour session).
- can reach Leatherhead or Kingston **using their own or public / community transport**.
